Join us for Part II of our 4th Annual NH Early Leadership Summit with national speaker and Early Childhood Education Specialist, **Luis Hernandez**. Establishing strong collaborations and partnerships with parents, families and the community broaden our efforts as a field and also sets the tone for continued success in meeting children's needs. The relationships we develop are essential in our work as early childhood professionals and as leaders. Next, this session will give emphasis to the understanding that every child is a unique individual. Lastly, we'll discuss the importance in knowing the social and cultural life of a child's family and community.

In the afternoon **"Polishing the Vision of Our Work: Five Ways to Rediscover the Leader in Me"** session, we will refresh the passion for the meaningful work we do with children and families. This starts in discovering the importance of being curious about new ideas, trends, and initiatives. We will discuss the importance of resilience and confidence in meeting the challenges of every day interactions. And as a team, giving value to individual contributions for the common good of the entire learning community. We will consider steps in taking risks, away from the usual comfort zones, as part of personal and professional growth.
